Course Description:

Review of concepts required for licensure examination and entry into the practice of professionalnursing. Includes review of application process for NCLEX RN test and test plan, nursing jurisprudence, obligations for professional growth and development.

Course requirements:

- 1. Online Open Resource: IHI Open School Modules Assesses understanding of introductory concepts related to quality improvement, patient safety, leadership, and person- and family-centered care in the inpatient setting.
- a. Online course quizzes will be awarded a certificate of completion. These certificates indicate the student's compliance and are to be uploaded by the due dates for full credit. (SLO 1, 3)
- Discussion Posts Assesses understanding of introductory concepts related to RN to BSN needs, quality improvement, patient safety, leadership, and person- and family-centered care in the inpatient setting. Students will receive their score and instructor feedback through the *My Grades* tool in Brightspace. Click on the *View Rubric* link to view criteriafor the grade received. (SLO 1, 3).
- 3. Written Assignments Includes an 8-page APA style paper on the ANA Code of Ethicsand a Resume with Cover Page. Assesses ability to communicate in writing basic understanding of critical concepts required for entry into professional nursing (SLO 2)
- 4. Nursing Jurisprudence Exam Prep Course & Exam assesses knowledge of the Texas NPA and BON Rules/Regulations. (SLO 3, 4)
- 5. HESI Pharmacology Exam Comprehensive Pharmacology Assessment. Assesses NCLEX Next Generation Readiness (SLO 3).
- a. The exams will be administered during Week 12.
- 6. HESI RN Exit Exam. Assesses NCLEX Next Generation Readiness (SLO 3)
- a. The HESI RN Exit will be used as the final exam and will be administered twice. Conversion scores will be recorded:
- a. The first time the exam will be administered will be during Week 12.
- b. All students scoring less than 900 will be required to retake the HESI RN Exit exam during Week 16.
- c. All students scoring 900 or greater will be exempt from taking the final exam.
- d. For those students required to take the RN Exit #2, the grades from RN Exit #1 and RN Exit #2 will be averaged for the final grade on the Exit HESI.
- 7. NCLEX type Review Questions. A comprehensive exam review. (begins week 4). Prepares student for NCLEX Next Generation success. (SLO 3)

- 8. Written Assignments: Students will receive their score and instructor feedback through the *My Grades* tool in Brightspace. Click on the *View Rubric* link to view criteria for thegrade received.
- 9. All Grades are available through the *My Grades* tool in Brightspace.

Attendance is measured by completion of assignments at designated dates.

Week 1: RN to BSN Discussion Post

By *Friday of Week 1*, at 2359 *hours post your initial response* to the following questions. It is due on Friday in order to allow your peers time to respond. Click on "Create Thread" tobegin your post. You may type in Word and copy and paste into the Discussion Board using the Ctrl C function to copy and the Ctrl V function to paste.

1. Describe why professional organizations like the Institute of Medicine (IOM) and the American Nurses Association (ANA) support a Bachelor of Science (BSN) degree as an entry-level into nursing.

a. Support your answer with evidence.

2. Does the research support improved patient outcomes with BSN prepared nurses? a. Support your answer with evidence.

3. Provide an example of improved patient outcomes with an increased number of BSNprepared nurses in hospital settings.

By *Sunday, of Week 1 at 2359 respond to at least TWO of your peers* in one or more of thefollowing ways:

1. Ask a probing question, substantiated with additional background information, evidence orresearch.

2. Share an insight from having read your peer's postings, synthesizing the information toprovide new perspectives.

3. Offer and support an alternative perspective using readings from the module or the COMLibrary.

4. Validate an idea with your own experience and additional research.

5. Make a suggestion based on additional evidence drawn from readings or after synthesizingmultiple postings.

6. Expand on your peer's postings by providing additional insights or contrasting perspectivesbased on readings and evidence.

- 4. Demonstrated knowledge of the Texas BON rules that emphasize safety, as well asall federal, state, and local government and accreditation organization safety requirements and standards.

Each week will have an online assignment in IHI Open School. Each assigned course in IHI Open School will take approximately 1 hour to complete. - These assignments are worth 100% (each certificate).

Weeks 6 – 9: Module 3: ANA Code of Ethics - Online

Upon completion of this module the student will have:

- 1. Participated in activities that promote the development and practice of professionalnursing.
- 2. Demonstrated responsibility for continued competence in nursing practice, andhave developed insight through reflection, self-analysis, self-care, and lifelonglearning.
- 3. Applied knowledge, skills, and understanding of critical concepts required forentry into professional nursing, demonstrating individual competency level application to nursing content area, and exhibiting readiness for licensure examination.

The Code of Ethics for Nurses with Interpretative Statements was developed to guide nurses in ethical decision making and analysis. Nurses are expected to adhere to and embrace the standards of these provisions which include our values, morals, and ideals of the nursing profession (ANA, 2015).

- You will be introduced to the nine provisions outlined in the Code of Ethics forNurses.
- You will have one written assignment for this module. It is expected that you willuse the Tutoring Center to assist writing your paper in APA 7th ED format. Each assignment is worth 100%.
 - Paper will be graded by the Rubric attached to the assignment inBrightspace.

Upon completion of Module 4 the student will have:

- 1. Participated in activities that promote the development and practice of professionalnursing.
- 2. Demonstrated responsibility for continued competence in nursing practice, andhave developed insight through reflection, self-analysis, self-care, and lifelonglearning.
- 3. Applied knowledge, skills, and understanding of critical concepts required forentry into professional nursing, demonstrating individual competency level application to nursing content area, and exhibiting readiness for licensure examination.
- You will develop your professional cover letter, reference list, and resume. This can be completed earlier in the semester if needed for a graduate nurse residency program application. It will also be available for the BSN fair and can be modified for any employment or academic progression process.
 - This is considered a written assignment and is worth 100%. This grade isrolled up into your written assignment calculations. It is expected that thestudent will utilize the Tutoring Center.
- Assignment will be graded by the Rubric attached to the assignment inBrightspace.
- Additional Week 10 Requirements:

 - A certificate will be issued upon completion of this Online **PREPCOURSE**.

Weeks 11 - 13: Module 5 - Nursing Jurisprudence & Professional Licensure Requirements

Upon completion of this module, the student will have:

- 1. Demonstrated knowledge of the Texas Board of Nursing Practice Act and the Texas Board of Nursing Rules that emphasize safety, as well as all federal, state, and local government and accreditation organization safety requirements and standards.
- 2. Demonstrated knowledge of compliance with mandatory reporting

requirements of the Texas Nurse Practice Act.

Weeks 11 -13 will focus on:

• Review of the Licensure – Examination Process Checklist located on the TBON Website. The Brightspace Discussion board forum will be used to address questions and answers. Each Discussion board submission will be graded as passed as long as an entry ismade for each assignment.

Registration with Texas Board of Nursing to take licensure examination. *There is a \$75.00 feeto complete this process: it is a required step in order for you to register with Pearson Vue (which is an additional \$200.00 fee) to take your NCLEX-RN exam.* Upon receipt of your TBON registration / payment, they will grant access in about 10-14 days after registration, to take the Nursing Jurisprudence Exam.

- You are required to have taken and passed the Nursing Jurisprudence Exam by theend of Week 15
- LVN Transition students may not be required by the TBON to retake the Nursing Jurisprudence Exam. When you register for licensure with the TBON, you will get

an application checklist. If your checklist indicates your NJPE is not required, screenshot that page and upload in place of the NJPE certificate.

Week 12: HESI RN Pharmacology Exam

HESI RN Exit Exam: Students must score 900 or greater on this exam. If a student scores less than 900 then they must complete remediation AND take HESI RN Exit #2 scheduled on week 16.

All required HESI essential packet remediation must be completed as a "ticket totest" for the HESI RN Exit #2. <u>Due date will preceed exam #2 date by several</u> <u>days</u>. Student are REQUIRED to meet with an academic coach to sign remediation contract. Students are also REQUIRED to communicate progress on remediation with said coaches.

Weeks 14: Module 6: IHI Open School: PFC 202 - Having the Conversation: BasicSkills About End-of-Live-Care

In conjunction with the Boston University School of Medicine and The Conversation Project, the IHI Open School offers this course to introduce students and health professionals to basic skills for having conversations with patients and their families about **ad**-of-life care wishes. This course will also help you develop skills to have conversations with patients and their families about their preferences for care at the end of life. As part of developing these skills, the course invites you to "have the conversation" yourself, with a family member orother loved one.

Upon completion of this modules, the student will have: After completing this course, you will be able to:

- 1. Conduct conversations with patients and families to learn their wishes regardingend-of-life care.
- 2. Explain available treatment options to patients and families in terms they canunderstand.
- 3. Demonstrate how to answer difficult questions patients and families ask related toend-of-life care.
- 4. Facilitate conversations with patients and families to help them make decisions about end-of-life care, based on an understanding of what matters most to them.
