Course Description: This course is an overview of major topics covered on the National Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam.

Course requirements: Students will be required to read the chapters and study material as indicated on the course outline. Students will be responsible for answering questions in quiz and exam assessments measuring their understanding and ability to apply course facts and concepts.

Exams: There will be three multiple choice Top 300 Drug exams and 1 capstone final exam and numerous MOCK PTCE exams. ****Students MUST SCORE A 75% or higher on FINAL Capstone Exam to graduate from the program****

Mandatory Mid-Semester Meeting: All students are required to meet with the Pharmacy Technician Program Instructor at the mid-point of the semester. This meeting will be held virtually over Blackboard Collaborate or Microsoft Teams. This is an opportunity to discuss the student's standing in each course, identify regulatory requirements which must be met, develop a student academic plan, and complete mandatory paperwork.

Attendance and Participation: Students are expected to attend every class and arrive on time, just as you will be expected to do as a pharmacy technician. Pharmacy Technicians are a vital part of the pharmacy staff. Attendance will constitute a portion of your final grade as detailed below. Being absent or late (tardy) will affect attendance grade.

Determination of Course Grade/Detailed Grading Formula: Course work will consist of drug cards, 3 exams consisting of multiple choice questions covering brand/generic and classification for the Top 300 medications, multiple choice MOCK PTCE exams, multiple choice online practice exams and a comprehensive multiple choice capstone final exam.
