Course Description:

Review of concepts required for licensure examination and entry into the practice of professionalnursing. Includes review of application process for NCLEX RN test and test plan, nursing jurisprudence, obligations for professional growth and development.

Course requirements:

- 1. Online Open Resource: IHI Open School Modules Assesses understanding of introductory concepts related to quality improvement, patient safety, leadership, and person- and family-centered care in the inpatient setting.
 - Online course quizzes will be awarded a certificate of completion. These certificates indicate the student's compliance and are to be uploaded by the due dates for full credit. (SLO 1, 3)
- 2. Discussion Posts Assesses understanding of introductory concepts related to nurse stress and burnout, quality improvement, patient safety, leadership, and person- and family-centered care in the inpatient setting. Students will receive their score and instructor feedback through the *My Grades* tool in Brightspace. Click on the *View Rubric* link to view criteria for the grade received. (SLO 1, 3).
- 3. Written Assignments Includes an 8-page APA style paper on the ANA Code of Ethics and a Resume with cover letter. Assesses ability to communicate in writing basic understanding of critical concepts required for entry into professional nursing (SLO 2)
- 4. Nursing Jurisprudence Exam Prep Course & Exam assesses knowledge of the TexasNPA and BON Rules/Regulations. (SLO 3, 4)
- 5. HESI Pharmacology Exam Comprehensive NGN Pharmacology Assessment. Assesses NCLEX Next Generation Readiness (SLO 3).
 - The exams will be administered during Week 12.
- 6. HESI RN Exit Exam. Assesses NCLEX Next Generation Readiness (SLO 3)
- a. The HESI RN Exit will be used as the final exam and will be administered twice. Conversion scores will be recorded in the grade book.
- a. The first time the exam will be administered will be during Week 12.

- b. All students scoring less than 900 will be required to retake a different version of the HESI NGN RN Exitexam during Week 16.
- c. All students scoring 900 or greater will be exempt from taking the second HESI NGN RN Exit exam #2.
- d. For those students required to take the HESI NGN RN Exit #2, the grades from RN Exit #1 and RN Exit #2 will be averaged for the final grade on the Exit HESI.
- 7. CJ SIM Assignments. A s s i g n m e n t s . (begin week 3). Prepares student for NCLEX Next Generation success. Students will receive a completion grade of 100 on each module completed. Students will aim to score 85% on each module. (SLO 3)
- 8. Written Assignments: This includes the ANA Code of Ethics paper, resume and cover letter. Students will receive their score and instructor feedback through the *My Grades* tool in Brightspace. Click on the *View Rubric* link to view criteria for the grade received.
- 9. All Grades are available through the *My Grades* tool in Brightspace.

Week 1: Stress and Burnout in Nursing

Part One: Make an initial post synthesizing the data below.

Nursing is a job that is physically and mentally taxing. It requires focus and attention. (It is also extremely rewarding!) As with all things there are extremes that need balance.

The NCSBN conducted research to identify the personal and professional characteristics of nurses experiencing heightened workplace burnout and stress.

Step one: Read this article:

Step two: Formulate a professional, well thought out post answering the following questions:

- 1. Describe something that came from the research.
- 2. As a profession, what can we do going forward to make positive changes in nursing? (This must be supported by a research article)
- 3. What effective health practices do you plan to do for yourself, as you begin your nursing career to reduce stress and hopefully prevent burnout?

4. How might this affect patient care and ultimately outcomes? (There is a large amount of data on this.)

This can be written in paragraph or bullet point format as long as each item is addressed in complete sentences and proper grammar.

References must be dated within the last five years. They must be cited properly in the body of the work and listed at the end in APA formatting. Your APA manual discusses each.

Think about when you are educating your patient on the new diet they must follow. You need buy in. Even as a new nurse, you are a leader. A leader on your team, for your patients, your family, your community. You are setting an example whether you realize it or not.

Part One: Make an initial post by the date listed in your course calendar addressing the following:

- 1. Describe two characteristics of leaders, who may or may not have formal positions of authority.
- 2. The culture of leadership is changing. Describe and contrast the new versus old skill set of leaders today.
- 3. We must be willing to give up old practices because they no longer have value. List some practices that need to be left behind and what would be useful to bring a team together to let go of the old and embrace the new?

Support your post with research from at least one reputable source. Can be a peer reviewed journal or a book.

This can be written in paragraph or bullet point format as long as each item is addressed in complete sentences and proper grammar.

References must be dated within the last five years. They must be cited properly in the body of the work and listed at the end in APA formatting. Your APA manual discusses each.

- At the end of each assigned IHI Open School course, you will take the unit quiz. A passing score of 80% is required for a certificate to be issued. You may repeat the quiz as many times as needed to obtain a passing score.
- To complete the weekly assignment, you will upload the designated certificate in Brightspace. *Convert the certificates to a PDF format prior to uploading*.
- These assignments are worth 100% (each certificate).

CJ SIM Next Gen Quizzing

Upon successful completion, the student will:

- 1. Acquire additional strategies to understand and apply the knowledge and testing skills necessary to pass the NCLEX®-RN on their first attempt.
- 2. Develop and refine clinical judgment skills and clinical reasoning.
- 3. Improve understanding of the 8 Client Needs Categories and the 4 Integrated Processes utilized in the NCLEX®-RN Test Plan.
- 4. Employ an expanded understanding related to the provision of safe, client-centered care in the health care arena.
- 5. Understand the role of the entry level RN's transition into practice.
- 6. Employ the use of technology for individual learning and content mastery.

Each week CJ SIM Next Gen cases will be assigned. At the end of each case, you will take a short quiz. The student should strive for 85% score. To complete the weekly assignment, you will screenshot the page showing your name, the case name, and score. This will be saved and uploaded to the proper Brightspace assignment. The student will receive a 100% score for completion. If the student repeatedly scores below 85%, the student is to schedule to meet with one of the course faculty to discuss and improvement plan.

Upon successful completion, the student will:

- 3. Applied knowledge, skills, and understanding of critical concepts required forentry into professional nursing, demonstrating individual competency level application to nursing content area, and exhibiting readiness for licensure examination.

The Code of Ethics for Nurses with Interpretative Statements was developed to guide nurses in ethical decision making and analysis.

Nurses are expected to adhere to and embrace the standards of these provisions which include our values, morals, and ideals of the nursing profession (ANA, 2015).

- You will be introduced to the nine provisions outlined in the Code of Ethics forNurses.
- You will have one written assignment for this module. It is advised that you will use the Tutoring Center to assist writing your paper in APA 7th Edition format. Each assignment is worth 100%.
 - Paper will be graded by the Rubric attached to the assignment in Brightspace.

Resume and Cover Letter

Upon successful completion, the student will:

- Develop your professional cover letter, reference list, and resume. This
 can be completed earlier in the semester if needed for a graduate
 nurse residency program application. It will also be available for
 the BSN fair and can be modified for any employment or academic
 progression process.
 - This is considered a written assignment. This grade is rolled up into your written assignment calculations. It is expected that the student will utilize the Tutoring Center.

Nursing Jurisprudence & Professional Licensure Requirements

Upon successful completion, the student will:

- 1. Demonstrated knowledge of the Texas Board of Nursing Practice Act and the Texas Board of Nursing Rules that emphasize safety, as well as all federal, state, and local government and accreditation organization safety requirements and standards.
- 2. Demonstrated knowledge of compliance with mandatory reporting requirements of the Texas Nurse Practice Act.
 - Review of the Licensure Examination Process
 Checklist located on the TBON Website. The
 Brightspace Discussion board forum will be used to
 document completion. Each Discussion board
 submission will be graded as passed as long as an entry
 is made for each assignment.
 - Registration with Texas Board of Nursing to take licensure examination. There is a \$75.00 fee to complete this process: it is a required step in order for you to register with Pearson Vue (which is an additional \$200.00 fee) to take your NCLEX-RN exam. Upon receipt of your TBON registration / payment, they will grant access in about 10-14 days after registration, to take the Nursing Jurisprudence Exam.
 - You are required to have taken and passed the Nursing Jurisprudence Exam by the **end of Week 15.**
 - LVN Transition students may not be required by the TBON to retake the Nursing Jurisprudence Exam. When you register for licensure with the TBON, you will get an application checklist. If your checklist indicates your NJPE is not required, screenshot that page and upload in place of the NJPE certificate.

HESI NGN RN Pharmacology Exam

Comprehensive Next Generation style pharmacology exam. Conversion scores will be recorded in the grade book.

HESI NGN RN Exit Exam

Comprehensive Next Generation style exam. Students must score 900 or greater on this exam. If a student scores less than 900 then they must complete remediation AND take HESI RN Exit #2 scheduled on week 16.

• All required HESI essential packet remediation must be completed as a "ticket totest" for the HESI RN Exit #2. <u>Due date will preceed exam #2 date by several days</u>. Student are REQUIRED to meet with an academic coach to sign remediation contract. Students are also REQUIRED to communicate progress on remediation with said coaches.

IHI Open School: PFC 202 - Having the Conversation: BasicSkills About End-of-Live-Care

Upon successful completion, the student will:

- 1. Conduct conversations with patients and families to learn their wishes regardingend-of-life care.
- 2. Explain available treatment options to patients and families in terms they canunderstand.
- 3. Demonstrate how to answer difficult questions patients and families ask related toend-of-life care.
- 4. Facilitate conversations with patients and families to help them make decisions about end-of-life care, based on an understanding of what matters most to them.

In conjunction with the Boston University School of Medicine and The Conversation Project, the IHI Open School offers this course to introduce students and health professionals to basic skills for having conversations with patients and their families about end-of-life care wishes.

This course will also help you develop skills to have conversations with patients and their families about their preferences for care at the end of life. As part of developing these skills, the course invites you to "have the conversation" yourself, with a family member orother loved one.

- There are three lessons to complete this assignment. Plan on spending approximately 1hour 30 minutes on this assignment.
- To complete the assignment, you will upload the designated certificate in Brightspace. The assignment is worth 100% and this grade is rolled up intoModule I, IHI Open School Modules.

Before withdrawing students should speak with the instructor and consult an advisor. Students are permitted to withdraw only six times during their college career by state law. The last date to withdraw from the 1st 8-week session is October 11. The last date to withdraw from the 16-week session is November 28. The last date to withdraw for the 2nd 8-week session is December 7.

FN Grading: The FN grade is issued in cases of *failure due to a lack of attendance*, as determined by the instructor. The FN grade may be issued for cases in which the student ceases or fails to attend class, submit assignments, or participate in required capacities, and for which the student has failed to withdraw. The issuing of the FN grade is at the discretion of the instructor. The last date of attendance should be documented for submission of an FN grade.

Early Alert Program: The Student Success Center at College of the Mainland has implemented an Early Alert Program because student success and retention are very important to us. I have been asked to refer students to the program throughout the semester if they are having difficulty completing assignments or have poor attendance. If you are referred to the Early Alert Program you will be contacted by someone in the Student Success Center who will schedule a meeting with you to see what assistance they can offer in order for you to meet your academic goals.
