incomplete skills sheet. Which will result in the number grade of "0" and the letter grade of "F" for the lab skills portion of this course.

Attendance Policy: Every class is important to your success in school. Make every effort to attend all scheduled classes. A sign-in and sign-out sheet will be provided in each class. Each student must sign themselves in and out daily. If a student misses one (1) hour or up to half the class period, the grade will reflect an absence. Any student missing time in daily class attendance (morning, mid-day, or afternoon), shall be considered absent for the day. Any time missed will affect the total number of hours needed for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: each tardy equals 30 points off the attendance grade. Each absence equals 100 points off the attendance grade. If a student misses four (4) absences, they will be dismissed from the program. It is the student's responsibility to withdraw through the admissions department.

**Tardy Policy:** Entering the class after the time class begins is counted as a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence. Every *three* (3) tardies will equal one absence.

# TDLR Preparation for the State Board Written Licensing Examination Spring 2025

**IMPORTANT**: Eligibility for an occupational license may be impacted by one's criminal history. Students with a criminal history should confer with faculty or the department chairperson. Students have a right to request a criminal history evaluation letter from the applicable licensing agency.

Notice to Students Regarding Licensing: Effective September 1, 2017, HB 1508 amends the Texas Occupations Code Section 53 that requires education providers to notify potential or enrolled students that a criminal history may make them ineligible for an occupational license upon program completion. The following website provides links to information about the licensing process and requirements: <a href="www.tdlr.texas.gov">www.tdlr.texas.gov</a> Should you wish to request a review of the impact of criminal history on your potential TDLR Cosmetology Operator Certificate which leads to testing for licensure, prior to or during your quest for a certificate, you can visit <a href="www.tdlr.texas.gov">www.tdlr.texas.gov</a> and request a "Criminal History Evaluation": This information is being provided to all persons who apply or enroll in the program, with notice of the requirements as described above, regardless of whether or not the person has been convicted of a criminal offense. Additionally, HB 1508 authorizes licensing agencies to require reimbursements when a student fails to receive the required notice.

Disclaimers/Additional Policies: Instructors may, at their discretion, withdraw a student due to lack of attendance, or the inability to maintain the prescribed minimum rate of progress (70% average in all grading categories) stated in the course syllabus and in D2L platform.
