MyLab IT (MyITLab) requires an access code, available through the COM bookstore or may be purchased directly from the publisher's website. Ordering MyITLab from sources other than COM or Pearson, however, could result in the inability to access the MyITLab learning tools or the electronic textbooks.

A print version of "Technology in Action" is not required for this course. The bookstore does not stock print copies. For a print version, contact the publisher (Pearson) directly.

Required Software - Microsoft Office Applications:

Microsoft Office 365 or Microsoft Office 2019 (or later) Applications are required for the course assignments that are worked offline. These applications are free to COM college students. Required are Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, Excel and Access. Download instructions (where necessary) can be found in the course on the D2L Brightspace portal.

Course Description: This course presents an overview of computer systems and their use covering current issues such as the impact of computers on society, as well as the history and use of computers in business, education, and other modern settings, and the impact of the Internet. Topics include hardware, operating systems, and application software, providing practical knowledge and skills in word processing, spreadsheets (with data analysis), presentation graphics, and databases.

Course requirements: You are required to log into your D2L Brightspace portal at least once a day for announcements which include course updates, guidance to course activities, and current statuses of situations and procedures at COM. Your COM email should also be checked frequently. These communication methods provide important information to the class as a whole.

MyITLab is required to complete all coursework. Access to all course materials, assignments, and coursework in MyITLab is through the classroom link on the D2L Brightspace portal.

The work in this course must be accomplished on a computer, not a smart phone. A Windowsbased computer with a minimum of four gigabytes (GB) of RAM (Random Access Memory) is required. Alternatively, the coursework may be done on an Apple Macintosh but with compatibility aids. Additionally, you must have a reliable broadband Internet connection.

The COM computer lab can be used if you do not have a computer or Internet connection.

This is an online course and employs two learning systems: D2L Brightspace and MyITLab.

- **D2L Brightspace** is the web-based learning management system (LMS) employed by COM providing a web portal for access to all course classes, class coursework and materials, announcements, email messages, instructions for using MyITLab, and information on other helpful topics.
- **MyITLab** is a learning environment from Pearson that includes eText which is used for all reading assignments and tests on computing concepts, and provides simulation training and practice activities for assignments in Microsoft Office applications.

Late Work, Make-Up, and Extra-Credit Policy:

All students are expected to complete assignments and tests on time according to posted due dates. Late work and make-up work will be considered on a case-by-case basis, upon request.

Extra credit assignments are offered as exercises in Microsoft Office applications which will be due at the end of the semester. These are on the calendar in MyITLab and in the course outline of this syllabus. These are the only extra credit assignments. Each assignment has the possibility of adding one percentage point to your final grade. If you complete three extra credit assignments, for instance, making 100% on two of them and 50% on one, a total of 2.5 points would be added to your final grade. With a semester grade of 87.6, the extra credit points described would produce a final grade of 90.1 (87.6 + 2.5).

Attendance Policy: This is an online course. There are no set days or hours for classroom time. Attendance is based on the frequency of logging into the D2L Brightspace portal and MyITLab, and the coursework completed.

Communicating with your instructor: ALL communications with the instructor must be through your COM email or through the class portal in D2L Brightspace. Due to FERPA restrictions, faculty cannot share any information about performance in the class through other electronic means.
