Assignments, written and practical are completions grades. Assignments that are "incomplete" will receive a number grade of a "O".

Attendance Policy: Every class is important to your success in school. Make every effort to attend all scheduled classes. A sign-in and sign-out sheet will be provided in each class. Each student must

sign themselves in and out daily. If a student misses more than one (1) hour, up to half the class period, the grade will reflect an absence. Any student missing daily class attendance (morning, midday, or afternoon), shall be considered absent for the day. Any time missed will affect the total number of hours needed for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: each tardy equals 25 points off daily the attendance grade. Each absence equals a letter grade of a" 0" for the daily attendance grade. One Hundred (100) points will be taken off the attendance grade. If a student misses 4 absences, they will be dismissed from the program. It is the student's responsibility to withdraw through the admissions department.

Tardy Policy: Entering the class after the time class begins is counted as a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence. Every two tardies will equal one absence.

Criminal History Evaluation:

Effective September 1, 2019, HB 1508 amends the Texas Occupations Code Section 53 that requires education providers to notify potential or enrolled students that a criminal history may make them ineligible for an occupational license upon program completion.
