Each student must sign <u>themselves</u> in and out daily. If a student misses more than one (1) hour or up to half the class period, the grade will reflect an absence. Any time missed will affect the total number of hours needed for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: each tardy equals 20 points off the attendance grade. Each absence equals a "0" attendance grade. If a

student misses four (4) absences, they will be dismissed from the program. It is the student's responsibility to withdraw through the admissions department.

Tardy Policy: Entering the class after the time class begins is counted as a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence. Every **four (4)** tardies will equal one absence.
