Attendance Policy: Every class is important to your success in school. Make every effort to attend all scheduled classes. A sign-in and sign-out sheet will be provided in each class. Each student must sign themselves in and out daily. If a student misses more than one (1) hour, up to half the class

Any time missed will affect the total number of hours needed for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: each tardy equals 10 points off the attendance grade. Each absence equals 15 points off the attendance grade. If student misses more than 4 absences, they will be dismissed from the program. It is the student's responsibility to withdraw through the admissions department.

Tardy Policy: Entering the class after the time class begins is counted as a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence. Every two tardies will equal one absence.
