Course Description: This course is an introduction of the theory and practice of skin care. Students will learn to identify the terminology related to skin treatments, demonstrate proper application, and exhibit workplace competencies in skin care.

Course requirements: Students will complete an oral assignment/research paper, portfolio, organized binder, notes, daily grades, practical skills, MindTap assignments, chapter exams & final exams. Chapters for this class include 7,8,22,23, & 24.

Determination of Course Grade/Detailed Grading Formula: professionalism, attendance, unit assignments, unit tests, oral presentation, lab assignment, final exam. All written exams must be passed with a 70 or better. Students may retake **one** per test per course.

Daily Grade: Student will receive a participation grade every day of class. If student misses a class or doesn't participate in the daily lesson, they will receive a 0 for that day. Student must get their syllabus signed every day by instructor for professionalism & participation.

Professionalism Grade: Grade starts at 100. Anytime the following rules are broken, student will be deducted 5 points from their professionalism grade:

- Sleeping in class
- Sitting while you should be standing doing a practical assignment
- Not in dress code
- On phone during lecture or client lab
- Watching movies while in school
- Eating or drinking on client lab
- Being rude or disrespectful to instructor or classmate. Bullying is not tolerated & could result in being dropped from the program.
- Failure to do duties such as sanitizing desk at the end of class & performing assigned duties. Must put all supplies back after use.
- Not being prepared for the day, not having supplies for lecture, practical skills or client lab services. Students may NOT borrow supplies from their classmates.
- Cursing or using inappropriate language.

Late Work, Make-Up, and Extra-Credit Policy:

Attendance Policy: Every class is important to your success in school. Make every effort to attend all classes. A sign in sheet will be provided in each class. Each student must sign

themselves in and out daily. If a student misses more than half the class period, the grade will reflect an absence.

Any time missed will affect the total number days required for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: Each tardy is 5 points off the attendance grade. Each absence is 10 points off the attendance grade.

If a student misses more than 4 absences, they will be dismissed from the course, according to College of the Mainland policies. All courses must be completed and passed with a C or better to be able to advance to the next courses and to be able sit for the licenser exam. It is the student's responsibility to understand the course requirements and maintain sufficient attendance and work completion.

If a student is quarantined by their high school, students must join the classroom virtually to avoid getting an absence or tardy. Students must present instructor with a letter from their high school stating the student is quarantined to avoid getting an absent or tardy for the day. See Covid statement below.

Tardiness Policy: Entering the class after the time class begins is counted as a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence.

Withdrawal Policy: Students may withdraw from this course for any reason prior to the last eligible day for a "W" grade. Before withdrawing students should speak with the instructor and consult an advisor. Students are only permitted to withdraw six times during their college career by State law.

Disclaimers/Additional Policies: Instructors may, at their discretion, withdraw a student due to lack of attendance, inability to maintain the prescribed minimum rate of progress (70% test average) stated in the course syllabus or for behavior detrimental to the learning process of the

When student reaches 2 absences, the student will receive an early alert & a write up. Student can receive 4 absences every 8 weeks. The attendance policy starts over when their new class begins.

These will be assigned on a case-by-case basis. Communicate with your instructor about this. If these assignments are completed by the due date, the days missed will not count toward your absences.

Exposure / Quarantine: In the event a student has been exposed to COVID 19 and must quarantine, the following steps can be utilized to avoid being withdrawn for excessive absences.

1. Self-report on the Com website. Follow instructions given.
2. Email your instructor and inform them how many days you must quarantine.
3. The instructor will email the student (to COM email) instructions for attending class virtually via Teams or Zoom, and on assignments that can be completed from home. These will be on a case-by-case basis. If the student attends class virtually and assignments are completed by the due date, the days missed will not count toward your absences.
4. Should the student become ill while quarantined, communicate that to the instructor. Adjustments may be made to the assignments.
5. If student is quarantined by their high school, the instructor will need to be notified by the high school counselor via email.
6. If quarantined, to avoid receiving an absence, student will need to attend lecture virtually.

Plagiarism: Plagiarism is using someone else's words or ideas and claiming them as your own. Plagiarism is a very serious offense. Plagiarism includes paraphrasing someone else's words without giving proper citation, copying directly from a website and pasting it into your paper, using someone else's words without quotation marks. Any assignment containing any plagiarized material will receive a **grade of zero** and the student will be referred to the Office of Student Conduct for the appropriate discipline action. Google search, copy and paste are considered plagiarism.

Make-Up Policy: Written assignments/on line work may be turned in/completed on the **First** day back from an absence; Written tests may be made up by making arrangements with the instructor on the first day back from an absence (this is the students responsibility) Practical skills & Oral Reports may not be made up.
