Assignment that are "incomplete" will receive a number grade of a "O".

Attendance Policy: Every class is important to your success in school. Make every effort to attend all scheduled classes. A sign-in and sign-out sheet will be provided in each class. Each student must sign themselves in and out daily. If a student misses more than one (1) hour, up to half the class

period, the grade will reflect an absence. Any student missing in daily class attendance (morning, mid-day, or afternoon), shall be considered absent for the day. Any time missed will affect the total number of hours needed for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: each tardy equals 10 points off the attendance grade. Each absence equals 15 points off the attendance grade. If student misses more than 4 absences, they will be dismissed from the program. It is the student's responsibility to withdraw through the admissions department.

Tardy Policy: Entering the class after the time class begins is counted as a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence. Every two tardies will equal one absence.
