Course Description: The study of the basic types of industrial processes. Types of commercial processes will be explored and demonstrated. Students will demonstrate knowledge of basic types of industrial processes and their operation; explain chemical, physical and thermodynamic principles of industrial processes; perform calculations on industrial processes; and plot and graph process data. Prerequisites: <u>PTAC 1302</u>, <u>PTAC 1308</u>, <u>PTAC 1310</u>, <u>PTAC 1332</u>, <u>CHEM 1405</u>, and <u>PHYS 1410</u> or <u>PHYS 1401</u> with a grade of "C" or better.

Course requirements: This is a "hands-on" based course that teaches students the basics and understanding of tracing lines and drawing P&IDs, reading & writing operating procedures, operating systems (Tank Farm and Glass Distillation Unit), and teamwork.
