Late Work, Make-Up Work, and Extra – Credit Policy: Late work is not accepted. MindTap assignments & chapter exams, notes, Q&As, in class quizzes, oral report & nail project must be turned in on the due date mentioned above. Written and practical final exams can not be made up if the student is absent.

<u>Professionalism</u> – Cell phone usage during lecture, client lab, while working on a guest, is unacceptable. If I see you on your phone during these times 5 points will be deducted from your professionalism grade. Do not answer calls, facetime, skype, watching shows etc. while in the classroom. Please step outside the classroom to take a phone call. If cell phone usage becomes abused, I will have to enforce a NO cell phone policy. Student must bring their own supplies every day. If student must borrow supplies from another student, they will receive a 5-point deduction for each tool borrowed. Students may not gossip, curse or disrespect one another. Sleeping during class time is not allowed. A 10-point deduction will be given if student sleep during class.

Attendance Policy: Experiences in the classroom and laboratory cannot be adequately duplicated if a student is absent. In addition, the Cosmetology Program is designed to teach professional work habits, such as attendance. A student is not allowed to miss more than 4 sessions per course. If the student's absences surpass 4 sessions in any one course, the student will be dismissed from that course. The student will not receive credit for the course. If prior to "W" day, the student may withdraw from the course through the admissions office in order to receive a grade of "W". If after "W" day, or if the student fails to withdraw themselves, a grade of "F" will be issued.

Each day that you miss, student will receive a 15-point deduction from their attendance grade. If you have a school event or emergency, please discuss this with your instructor. Remember, each day that you are at school you are at an interview. You will need a referral for the workforce from your instructor. If you can't make it to class, then you won't make it to work. If you are absence from class, you will need to make up the 4 hours you missed that day. You need 1000 hours to complete this course.

<u>Tardiness Policy:</u> Entering the class after the time class begins in counted as a tardy. Leaving the class before it is over will result in a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence. 4 tardies equals 1 absence. You will be dropped after 4 absences. Each time you are late for class, or you leave early will result in a 10-point deduction from your attendance grade. If you need to be dismissed a few minutes early, you MUST tell your instructor that you're leaving early.

Contagious Illnesses:

- 2. For other contagious illnesses
 - a. Email the instructor with a copy of a doctor's note stating that you may not attend school, with dates and your name. (Any days missed prior to this will count toward total absences)
- 3. Once the instructor receives the Test result or doctor's note, they will email the student (to COM email) instructions on assignments that can be completed from home. These will be assigned on a case-by-case basis.

Communicate with your instructor about this. If these assignments are completed by the due date, the days missed will not count toward your absences.

Maternity appointments:

For doctor appointments due to maternity, the following steps can be utilized to avoid being withdrawn for excessive absences.

- 1. Communicate with your instructor prior to the appointment of the absence.
- 2. Bring a note from the doctor stating the appointment date and time upon returning to class.
