**Course Description:** This course is a presentation of the theory and practice of nail technology. Instruction identifies terminology related to nail technology, demonstrates the proper application of nail technology and exhibits workplace competencies in nail technology.

**Course requirements:** Three class projects will be required during this course. One will be a Written report, an Oral report, and a Nail Art Practical project.

**Late Work, Make-Up, and Extra-Credit Policy:** Arrangements for written exams must be made up the next day of class. The student is responsible for scheduling the makeup test session with the course instructor. If a student misses classwork it must be turned in the following class period after the work was given. In general, late work is not accepted. All work must be turned in on time or the student will receive a zero.

**Attendance Policy:** Every class is important to your success in school. Make every effort to attend all classes. A sign in sheet will be provided in class. Each student must sign themselves in and out daily. If a student misses more than half the class period, the grade will reflect an absence. Any time missed will affect the total number of days required for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: Each tardy is 5 points off the attendance grade. Each absence is 10 points off the attendance grade. If a student misses more than 4 absences, they will be dismissed from the course, according to College of the Mainland policies. All courses must be completed and passed with a C or better to be able to advance to the next courses and to be able sit for the licensor exam. It is the student's responsibility to understand the course requirements, maintain sufficient attendance, and work completion.
