3. Course Description

College Algebra is an in-depth study and applications of polynomial, rational, radical, exponential, and logarithmic functions, and systems of equations using matrices.

A graphing calculator is needed for this course. A Texas Instruments TI 83 Plus or TI 84 Plus or a Casio graphing calculator is recommended. A TI 89 or higher cannot be used in this course.

6. Determination of Course Grade

Grading Formula: The course grade will be determined by the following formula:

Final Average = 64%Chapter Exam Average + 16%Final Exam

+ 10%Homework Average + 10%Quiz Average

The Final Exam score will replace the lowest Chapter Exam Score when it is larger.
