Course Description: An overview of chemical reformation and related theory, and practical application of perm and relaxers.

Late Work, Make-Up, and Extra-Credit Policy: any late work due to an absence should be turned in upon the return to class, make-up tests should be scheduled with the instructor. There is no make up for practical or final exams.

Attendance Policy: Students must maintain regular attendance to guarantee completion of hours by the end of the program. Every class is important to your success in school. A sign-in-sheet will be provided in each class and must be signed in and out daily.

Tardiness: Entering the class after the time class begins OR leaving the class before it has ended will be counted as a tardy. Each tardy will result in a 5-point deduction from the daily attendance grade. Four tardies count as one absence.

Absence: Any missed time will affect the total number of hours needed for completion. If a student misses 1 or more hour per session, the grade will reflect an absence. Each absence will

result in a 10- point deduction from your grade. If a student misses more than 10 percent of class time in any one course, they will be dismissed from the course. If prior to the "W" day, the student may withdraw through the admission department.
