Attendance Policy:

Every class is important to your success in school. Make every effort to attend all scheduled classes. A sign-in and sign-out sheet will be provided in each class. Each student must sign themselves in and out daily. If a student misses more than one (1) hour or up to half the class period, the daily grade will reflect an absence. Any student missing time in daily class attendance (morning, mid-day, or afternoon), shall be considered absent for the day. Any time missed will affect the total number of hours needed for completion. Attendance grades are calculated as follows: each tardy equals 30 points off the attendance grade. Each absence equals 100 points off the attendance grade. If a student misses 4 absences, they will be dismissed from the program. ***It is the student's responsibility to withdraw through the admissions department.***

Tardy Policy: Entering the class after the time class begins is counted as a tardy. Entering the class after the halfway mark of the class is counted as an absence. Every **three (3) tardies** will equal one absence.

Notice to Students Regarding Licensing: Effective September 1, 2017, HB 1508 amends the Texas Occupations Code Section 53 that requires education providers to notify potential or enrolled students that a criminal history may make them ineligible for an occupational license upon program completion. Should you wish to request a review of the impact of criminal history on your potential TDLR Cosmetology Operator Certificate which leads to testing for licensure, prior to or during your quest for a certificate, you can visit www.tdlr.texas.gov and request a "Criminal History Evaluation": This information is being provided to all persons who apply or enroll in the program, with notice of the requirements as described above, regardless of whether or not the person has been convicted of a criminal offense. Additionally, HB 1508 authorizes licensing agencies to require reimbursements when a student fails to receive the required notice.
