Late Work, Make-Up Work, and Extra – Credit Policy: Late work is not accepted. MindTap assignments & chapter exams, notes, Q&As, in class quizzes, oral report & nail project must be turned in on the due date mentioned above. Written and practical final exams cannot be made up if the student is absent.

<u>Professionalism</u> – Cell phone usage during lecture, client lab, while working on a guest, is unacceptable. If a student is on the phone during the times mentioned, 5 points will be deducted from their professionalism grade. Student must not answer phone calls, watch Netflix or other shows/movies etc. while in the classroom. When a student receives a phone call, they must step outside the classroom do avoid disruption. If cell phone usage becomes abused, the instructor will have to enforce a NO cell phone policy. Student must bring their own supplies every day. If student must borrow supplies from another student, they will receive a 5-point deduction for each tool borrowed. Students may not gossip, curse or disrespect one another. Sleeping during class time is not allowed. A 10-point deduction will be given if student is caught sleeping during class.

Attendance Policy: Experiences in the classroom and laboratory cannot be adequately duplicated if a student is absent. In addition, the Cosmetology Program is designed to teach professional work habits, such as attendance. A student is not allowed to miss more than 4 sessions per course. If the student's absences surpass 4 sessions in any one course, the student will be dismissed from that course. The student will not receive credit for the course. If prior to "W" day, the student may withdraw from the course through the admissions office in order to receive a grade of "W". If after "W" day, or if the student fails to withdraw themselves, a grade of "F" will be issued.

Each day that a student is absent during class, the student will receive a 10-point deduction from their attendance grade. If you have a school event or emergency, please discuss this with your instructor. Remember, each day that you are at school you are at an interview.

<u>Tardiness Policy:</u> Entering the class after the time class begins in counted as a tardy. Leaving the class before it is over is tardy. by the due date, the days missed will not count toward your absences.

<u>Exposure / Quarantine:</u> In the event a student has been exposed to COVID 19 and must quarantine, the following steps can be utilized to avoid being withdrawn for excessive absences.

- 2. Email your instructor and inform them how many days you must quarantine.
