Course Description:

Examine the major safety management issues that affect the workplace including safety awareness, loss control, regulatory issues, and human behavior modification.

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

1. Develop and implement safety program
2. Describe cost benefit analysis
3. Summarize the basic components of human behavior modification
4. Apply the components of the safety audit process including record keeping requirements

Course requirements:

Bring Your “A” Game to Work (BYAG): You will be required to complete a Pre-test, Chapter tests and a final certification exam. All tests will be online through the BYAG website below. You will be assigned a login and password that are unique to you.

1. Go to <https://certification.workethic.org/login>
2. Type in your assigned username and password
3. In the top right corner, click on the picture icon and select Profile from the dropdown options
4. Click on Edit Profile
5. Type in First and Last Name
6. Scroll to the bottom and click Update Profile
7. Select the blue course link under Course details. From here you can begin taking the behavior quizzes and/or exam

Examinations: There will be one final exam, which will be over the material covered in the previous fifteen weeks. The final exam will be closed book. Exam must be taken at the designated time unless prior arrangements have been made with the professor. Students who are absent and have not made prior arrangements will not be allowed to make up an exam and will receive the grade of “0” (zero).

Project Report: Each student is required to write one project report and present the report to the class. Topics and specific instructions for the report will be provided by the instructor. Students are expected to submit their papers on the date the assignment is due. **If they are turned in late, the student will receive a 50% reduction in points unless prior arrangements are made with the instructor.**

Homework: Three (3) homework assignments will be given. Each homework assignment has a maximum of 50 points each. Failure to turn in a required homework at the prescribed time will result in zero “0” points awarded for the assignment. If you cannot make the class, you must email the homework to your professor, at the email address provided here, prior to the beginning of the class time on the date it is due.

Quizzes: There will be four quizzes, which will be over the materials covered in the previous weeks. The quizzes will be closed book.
